

Patient: with forefoot phlegmon in diabetes
with borderline amputation and repeated resection



Diagnosis upon admission: gangrene with forefoot phlegmon



Borderline amputation for the treatment of the infection with amputation of the big toe and the second toe. Subsequently, additional gangrene of the third toe and increasing CRP.



Repeated resection as transmetatarsal amputation with plantar lobe and adapted suture.



Skin necrosis in the area of the suture. Wound cavity after removing sutures.



MOMOSAN white.



Dressing after 3 days.



Good granulation tissue formation in the area of the transmetatarsal amputation. Continuous necrosis plantar on the soft tissue flap.



Another repeated resection of the plantar soft tissue flap.
